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ALL ADULTS AND MINORS G.S. 122C-51-62 APSM 95-2	The right to, within 30 days of admission to a facility, have an individual written treatment or habilitation plan implemented by the facility.				
	Right to be free from unnecessary medication. Medication shall not be used for punishment, discipline or staff convenience.				
	Right to receive necessary treatment for an prevention of physical ailments based upon the consumer's condition and projected length of stay.				
	The right to have, as soon as practical during treatment or habilitation, but not later than the time of discharge, an individualized written discharge plan containing recommendations for further services designed to enable the consumer to live as normally as possible.				
	Send & receive sealed mail -have access to writing material, postage, and staff assistance when necessary. Facility shall make limited postage available to indigent consumers				
	Contact and consult with, at his/her own expense and at no cost to the facility, legal counsel, private physicians and private MH/DD/SA professionals of his choice.				
	Contact and consult with a consumer advocate if there is a consumer advocate.				
	Adult consumers shall have access to telephones in private areas, when requested by the consumer				
	Efforts shall be made to provide a quiet atmosphere for uninterrupted sleep during scheduled sleeping hours				
	Efforts shall be made to provide areas accessible to the consumer for personal privacy, for at least limited periods of time, unless determined inappropriate by the treatment/habilitation team.				

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ALL ADULTS AND MINORS G.S. 122C-51-62 APSM 95-2	Each consumer may suitably decorate his room, or portion of a multi resident room , with respect to the consumer's choice, normalization principles, and with respect for the physical structure.				
	Facilities may establish written policies and justifications which limit this right in certain circumstances such as				
	Each consumer shall be assured the right to dignity, and humane care in the provision of personal health, hygiene and grooming care. Such rights shall include, but limited to:				
	opportunity for a shower/tub bath daily, or more as needed				
	opportunity to shave at least daily;				
	opportunity to obtain the services of a barber/beautician				
	provisions of linens and towels, toilet paper and soap				
	provision of individual personal hygiene articles for each indigent consumer. Articles include but are not limited to toothpaste, toothbrush, sanitary napkins, tampons, shaving cream and shaving utensil.				
Bathtubs or showers and toilets which ensure individual privacy shall be available.					
Adequate toilets, lavatory and bath facilities equipped for use by a consumer with a mobility impairment shall be available

	Right to opportunities that enable him to mature physically, emotionally, intellectually, socially and vocationally.				
Additional Rights for Minors in 24 hour Facilities G.S. 122C - 62	Communicate and consult with his parents or guardian or the agency or individual having legal custody of him.				
	Contact and consult with, at his own expense, or that of his legally responsible person at not cost to the facility, legal counsel				

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Rights that can be restricted for Adults & minors G.S. 122C - 62	Make and receive confidential calls				
	Receive visitors between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m. for a period of at least 6 hours daily 2 hours of which shall be after 6:00 p.m.				
	Communicate under appropriate supervision with individuals of their own choice upon the consent of the individuals.				
	Make visits outside the custody of the facility unless commitment proceedings prohibit, unless the consumer was admitted from a correctional facility or unless consumer is being held to determine capacity to proceed to trial.				
	Be outdoors daily and have access to facilities and equipment for physical exercise, several times/week.				
	Keep and use personal clothing and possessions				
	Participate in religious worship				
	Keep and spend reasonable amounts of own money				
	Retain a drivers license				
	Have access to individual storage space for private use				
	Send and receive mail and have access to writing materials, postage, and staff assistance when necessary.
